For those with ancient sails, we can get Bruce to measure your sail. Remember a boat's PHRF is solely the responsibility of the skipper.

Lastly, I want to remind all racers about the Racers' Meeting on April 23rd, 2014 at 6:30 pm. Remember refreshments and burgers are on the house. All are welcome to attend.

On the cruising side, I note that all the TH&SC cruises are now listed on the events calendar found on the TH&SC website. I strongly recommend that you participate in these events. 
For the information of new members:

MEASURE YOUR MAST!

FTER LAUNCH we will commence the construction and relocation of our mast racks, including a boom rack so that booms will no long

rack so that booms will no longer clutter the mast racks. In order for us to do this effectively, we are going to have a record of all the masts at the club, and we need to know how long each mast is. If I can ask every boat owner to make a record of the length of their mast BEFORE the masts go up it will make it possible for us to collect this data both at launch or shortly thereafter. Measuring your mast after it is securely attached to your vessel is a complicated exercise that may involve either trigonometry or danger pay, so your help is required. The collection of this data is a job that has yet to be assigned, so if you would like to volunteer please call me or email me. Launch may be an opportune time to start the list.


