
Election Meeting Monday, September 28th In the clubhouse

## Rudi Strenge - 1928 - 2015



It is with sadness that I must report that Life Member Rudi Strenge passed away on August 1st in his 87th year.

Rudi and his wife Elfi joined TH&SC in the mid-1970s with a Sandpiper sailboat named Erolia. After a few years they bought a used C&C 25 named Rusty Nail. They sailed and cruised Rusty Nail until 1981 when they bought Snowy Plover, a new Nonsuch 26 that they sailed until they found the upkeep of a sailboat too much for them. They sold *Snowy Plover* to fellow club member Sylvie Lavoie. *Snowy Plover* is still in the club.

In the mid-80s Rudi volunteered to be Treasurer and efficiently organized the club finances. Rudi and Elfi supported the club events throughout their boat owning period. After selling Snowy Plover Rudi and Elfi travelled the world extensively two or three times a year. Elfi had to cancel a trip they had booked for this Fall.

Rudi was a commercial photographer who loved taking pictures of birds he found while sailing his boat around Lake Ontario. Rudi became proficient in taking large blowups of photographs and then peeling off the emulsion to mount in art frames. For a long time Elfi and Rudi were official bird keepers who cared for injured birds until they could be released. Rudi always loved a good joke and was a charter member of TH&SC's Screwball Society. One instance was while painting his boat's name on the transom a fellow member asked him to paint the name of his boat across the back too. Rudi said "sure" and when his neighbour returned the next day there was the name—"Easy Does It Across The Back".

Rudi will be missed by many. Our sincere condolences to Elfi and the Strenge family.

Happy Bastille Day! This is the day the French celebrate the storming of the Bastille during the French Revolution. When we were in Paris with *Veleda* in 2000 we stayed at the Arsenault Marina at Place de Bastille in downtown Paris. The prison is no longer there, but an obelisk dominates the plaza.

The local library has good but slow internet connections and so I will send this out before we leave tomorrow. The gentleman staffing the library desk was a burly bearded pleasant chap with a pistol strapped to his belt. When I asked why he was carrying he indicated he was also a police constable and had a pair of handcuffs on the other side of his belt. Wow, I wouldn't want to be late handing in a book or caught talking in that library! Hartley Bay, BC July 23, 2015

We are hunkered down at the government dock in this native community (population 200) waiting out miserable cool rainy, foggy weather. We have had one day of summer a few days ago. Strange, as the west, the prairie provinces and most of B.C. have been having dry to drought conditions resulting in hundreds of forest fires, yet up here it is rainy.

Small world department; two other boats here are ones we have met previous years! *Ectasea* we met last year in Desolation Sound, and *Sea Vagabond* is a vessel that has wintered with Veleda on Thetis Island.

This log gets us up to Juneau and over to the famed Glacier Bay. On the way we passed the Mendenhall Glacier outside of Juneau, saw several whales in our transit, and met the *Statendam*, a Holland America Line cruise ship we are taking from Vancouver to Singapore this fall.

Hakai Beach Institute, Calvert Island, B.C. Aug. 4, 2015

We are getting ready for our first overnight passage this year, going from the north of Calvert Island around Cape Scott on the north tip of Vancouver Island, and down the west coast outside. We met up with my brother's grandson Ben who is working at the institute here as a

marine biologist. We went out with him and some other researchers netting and counting fish in a couple of area bays, part of an annual survey of fish life.

We are getting ready for our first overnight passage down to Vancouver Island. All is well with us so far.

THIS YEAR we've sent out our reciprocal notices by email, for the first time, rather than with a printed letter and card sent by snail mail. The move (which saved the club \$95.60 at 2014 postal rates) came about in concert with the majority of other clubs on Lake

The documents we sent out were—if you'll forgive my polishing my own apple here—among a scant handful of handsomely customized notifications. They used a version of the elegant letterhead that Chris Hanson (skipper of Groovin') designed for us, updated to electronic format.

I would very much like to propose the signing of a friendship agreement that would help expand and strengthen the bonds of friendship and collaboration between our two nautical born institutions."

The 2015 edition of the "Cruisers' Reciprocal Club List" has the reciprocal policy of every club I've been able to verify. If you visit and find they have a different policy, please let me know at reciprocals@thsc.ca. Many will mirror our visitor policy of two nights free, followed by two nights at \$20/night. Some of the busier clubs, especially those in the Bay of Quinte, have different policies; there's a binder in the wooden case beside the patio door with information on most clubs.

Not all clubs have responded this vear, and some haven't for several years. However we should welcome to TH&SC everyone who has proof they're a member of a boating club, and urge them to send us a reciprocal notification.

**ORK CHITS** I want to take this opportunity to introduce the TH&SC Work Hours Receipt. The purpose of this is to improve the recording and documentation of hours worked by club members. Please ensure you have one of these filled out every time you do work at the club. If you don't we'll likely have a discussion sometime in November to try and figure out what was and was not done. That is never any fun and is best avoided.

First, it is a three part non-carbon paper form. Please follow the distribution instructions on the bottom of the form. Once the form is fully completed COPY 1 goes to Ways and Means; COPY 2 goes to the Executive who thought up the job; and COPY 3

goes to you, dear member. Keep your copy for your records.

Second, the forms are all serial numbered so we can be certain the work is properly accounted for. Then, when we are working late at night sometime in October and trying to sort out the usual confusion to tally up the hours worked the task should be made easier and with less errors.

Third, the filling out the form should be intuitive, but if not here is a guide to the more complex parts. "Authorized By" means the Executive, and only the Executive, who authorized the work in the first place. It is really important that work is authorized by the Harbour Master, Property Manager, or Social Chair before it starts. Why, you ask? Because we have a lot of critical work that really needs to get done, like building a new sea wall, and we can't be consuming time doing work that is of a lower priority.

The "Approved" field is for the

executive or their delegate who signs off and verifies that the assigned work was done as stated and the hours allocated are correct. The rest of the form should be straightforward. If not, ask me to explain.


