S I WRITE THIS, it is just four days until the first day of Haul Out. With the water levels dropping very quickly, it has been decided that we will have to take drastic measures to get all the boats out of the water. For some boats with a deeper draft, we will need to pull them from a platform set up well out and away from the wall. We are hoping that the club barge will serve as our platform. By the time you read this however, Haul Out will have come and gone. I'm keeping my fingers crossed.

Elections in September saw two new members come to the plate and I am sure that Peggy Wheatstone and Steve Brown will both hit home runs in the next couple of years. While Peggy has served before as Treasurer, Steve Brown comes to serve as your new Harbourmaster with a great skill set. I will assist Steve for as long as he needs me to, aiding him with the ins and outs of various procedures. Please take time to welcome them both to their posts.

As for me, I have mixed feelings about leaving the responsibilities as Harbourmaster. I am happy in one way because I get to claw back some time and tackle some long ignored projects. On the other side, I will miss so very much serving as your Harbourmaster. The membership has been so good to me and your patience exceeded my expectations. Mostly I am grateful for getting to know all of you better over the last five years.

I thought I would throw out there a few reminders for the membership while your boats sit on the hard over the winter. Please be sure to contain any antifreeze spilled while winterizing your boat. For those unaware, raw antifreeze is poisonous and yet animals like the taste. Dogs digesting antifreeze can go through a complete shut down of the liver and kidneys and more often they will die. Please dispose of your antifreeze in the waste bin provided for antifreeze. Be sure to cover your boat over the winter. It is your choice after all but be aware that water finding it's way into leaking areas of your boat will freeze and expand causing even more damage.

Please feel free to plug your boat in while at the club but please do not leave your boat for days or even weeks on end plugged in and unattended.

Faulty electrical equipment can cause major fires and it may not just be your boat damaged from a fire, but other boats around you.


Please keep the area around your boat tidy. Having a mess around your boat can cause members to trip causing serious injury.

Do not leave your ladder leaning on your boat while unattended. Lock your ladder to your cradle under your boat and ensure there are no dock lines dangling allowing access to your boat. Remember that allowing thieves access to your boat also allows them access to many other boats as well.

In closing I just wish to say thanks to all for a great sailing season in 2012. Also many thanks to all of those assisting me in my adventure as Harbourmaster for the past five years. Cheers everyone!



ELL, another sailing season is behind us. And so it's time again to examine the comings and goings at the club. Actually it's interesting going through the visitor's sign-in log and the members' sign out log to see where everyone came from

I thought it was a great sailing season, however the number of TH&SC members who signed out for overnight trips dropped to 130. That compares to 182 in 2011, 173 in 2010 and 161 in 2009. Maybe I missed counting a couple of pages or everyone mostly went for day sails like me.

The 152 visiting boats this year belonged to 31 clubs (26 Canadian; five U.S.) from as far away as Collins Bay. The number of clubs is consistent with prior years. However, the number of visitors is down from 182 last year, but is comparable with 147 from two years ago.

In past years, Whitby has by far accounted for the most visiting boats. However this year, Lakeshore jumped ahead with 31, followed by Highland with 23, Whitby YC with 16, Bluffers Park with 11 and Frenchman's Bay with seven to round out the top 5 clubs. Whitby may be a contender for second place standing if the six Port Whitby Marina boats are lumped in with the Whitby Yacht Club. (And yes, the Port Whitby Marina boats can have reciprocal rights.)

Finally, I would like to thank all of you who completed their 4 hour tour of duty this year (99% of you showed up). Compared to what I've heard at other clubs who have difficulty getting members to help out to greet visitors and make sure the grounds are safe, we have a very admirable record. Keep
